On a beautiful, sunny morning, the two best teams of the season faced off in the Grand Final at Pakenham. In what has become somewhat of a rivalry between the two teams, this match was set to be a cracker from the onset! First blood was drawn by the Kangas before the game had even started, with the unfurling of the banners, thus setting the tone for what was to come. Being forced to kick into a strong breeze to start the game, the Rooboys worked hard throughout the quarter, running and carrying the ball from their defence to forward 50 multiple times. Eventually, they were able to get the first score on the board thanks to a goal square snap. Unfortunately, it was touched off the boot, resulting in only a minor score. The Beaconsfield players continued to attack and drive the ball into the attacking 50, and were eventually rewarded with a goal close to the quarter break, giving them a five-point lead at the first change.
