Officer Recreation Reserve, Western Oval – The origins of the unlucky number 13 date back to ancient times. Whether it be the omission of a 13th law from a famous legal document or that simply the number 12 is considered an ideal number so, following it was less than ideal, the number 13 has a bad reputation in many cultures. Whether it really is an ill-fated value or not, the facts are that in Round 13, the Under 13 Officer Boys Blue played a game of football with a starting game-time temperature of 13 degrees. There was certainly an eerie feeling about the game. At least it wasn't a Friday.

Visitors Carrum-Patterson Lakes visited Officer for the first time and from the opening bounce, showed exactly why they are the reigning FDJFL premiers, running out comfortable 38-point winners.
